Scouts Canada Commemorative Centennial Medal

This medal has been created by Scouts Canada to commemorate the past 100 years and celebrate the beginning of the next 100 years of Scouting in Canada. It will honour our members and those in the community who have made a significant contribution to Scouting.

Medal Design:

The colors in the ribbon represent our youth sections: Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Venturers and Rovers.

Purpose

To commemorate the past 100 years and to celebrate the beginning of the next 100 years of Scouting in Canada. Presentations should begin Scout-Guide week 2007 and completed by Scout-Guide week 2008

- Youth and adults are eligible for the award
- Emphasized should be quality service rendered to Scouting in the past three years
- Awarding the CCM is independent of having received other awards or having acted in any particular capacity of service
- Honours and Awards committees may ask for members of Scouts Canada to recommend other members
- All members of Scouts Canada are eligible
- A recipient must be a registered member in good standing and/or councils may recognize members of the community who have made substantial contributions to the Scouting Movement (as per National Strategic Direction #3)
- The medal will be worn per BP&P (section 9000). The emblem is to be worn as a permanent part of the uniform.

Cost

- Each council will be responsible for the cost of their medals.
- Each Commemorative Centennial Medal package will consist of the medal complete with ribbon, emblem and certificate.
- Councils will place their order with National Retail Services, who will then order a bulk quantity. Orders can be placed by Executive Directors, e-mailing quantity required to National Retail Services Director Alan Mimeault at: amimeault@scouts.ca. **Please order by January 02, 2007.**

Procurement and Distribution

- National Retail Services will be responsible for the procurement and distribution of medals to councils.

Completing the application

The service rendered must be of a quality nature and **not the faithful performance of the ordinary duties attached to the office or position.** Please state clearly what outstanding service the person performed and how Scouting has benefited as a result. Do not include services to church, civic and government organizations etc.

Has your nominee demonstrated:

- Excellence in program delivery
- Excellence in performance and initiatives
- Leadership in creating a culture that encourages and supports youth, adults and staff contributions
- Practices, policies or programs that can serve as a model for others
- Aims and Principles of Scouting
- Innovation through creative utilization of resources
- Ability to carry out predetermine goals or objectives with measurable results
- Ability to make an impact in the Scouting community

- Reliable
- Motivated and energetic
- Enthusiastic
- Team player
- Role model
- Other

Please include a brief description of activities that you feel make your nominee eligible for the Commemorative Centennial Medal. Provide some background or history on the person you are nominating, and any other relevant details about the individual that might have a bearing on the nomination. Activities/initiatives must have taken place or been developed within Scouting **within the last three years.**

Nominations should be no longer than two pages in length, plus a letter of commendation or testimony. Use examples wherever possible: don't assume the Selection Committee knows the nominated volunteer or the extent of his or her activities. Please be as detailed as possible and include all information that distinguishes your nominee.

Additional Material

You may include supporting materials such as letters of recommendation, publications, media stories or tributes. Please limit additional materials to items that provide new information or insight into who the nominee is and the nature of the contributions. **Please do not send originals or important or official documents, as they may not be returned.**



Frequently Asked Questions

1. Who is eligible?
 - Both youth and adults are eligible for the award.
 - Awarding the CCM is independent of having received other awards or having acted in any particular capacity of service.
 - A recipient must be a registered member in good standing and/or councils may recognize members of the community who have made substantial contributions to the Scouting movement (as per the National Strategic Direction #3).
2. Can I nominate someone in a different council?

Yes! The final selection will be that of the holding council
3. Can I nominate someone who was a member of Scouting?

Yes - at the discretion of the council, and as long as it is confirmed the individual was a member in good standing.
4. My nomination is for a group of volunteers who have worked together and performed beyond expectations and I really can't single out just one. Can couples or groups be nominated for a CCM?

The CCM is for individual recognition. Couples and groups are not eligible. However, the council is appreciative of all volunteer groups who make a positive difference in our organization and community. You are encouraged to notify your council office of any volunteer group(s) you feel worthy of recognition. Please provide the name of the group, the volunteer activities and a complete mailing address.
5. Who can submit a nomination?

There are no restrictions. Awards nominations are accepted from all individuals, groups and organizations.
6. How do I nominate someone?

To nominate you'll need to complete a CCM application nomination form available from your council office or the Scouts Canada web site.
7. When is the nomination deadline?

It will be the local council's responsibility to set the date and communicate it to the rest of the council.
8. What happens to nominations received after the nomination deadline?

To be fair to all nominees and to allow each council's Selection Committee sufficient time to consider all the nominations, late nominations will not be considered.
9. What criteria does the Selection Committee use to determine who receives the awards?

The Council Selection Committee reviews the nominations received using the following criteria as a guideline to evaluate the nominees.

 - **Continuous** - high level, ongoing involvement/commitment
 - **Extraordinary** - nominee's work or contributions should be described as outstanding or remarkable, with a level of involvement beyond that of most.
10. How are award nominees recognized?

There will be a number of opportunities throughout the councils. It will be the council's responsibility as to how and when they are recognized.



11. How many medals are being presented?
This is at the discretion of the council.
12. How are national volunteers to be recognized?
Anyone can nominate a national volunteer and submit the nomination to the next senior volunteer for the nominee.
13. Who will be responsible for the selection of those to be awarded the CCM ?
The Honours and Awards committee of each council is responsible.
Due to the emphasis on increasing the traditional Scouting awards, Honours and Awards committees may wish to strike a separate committee to facilitate the selection process.
