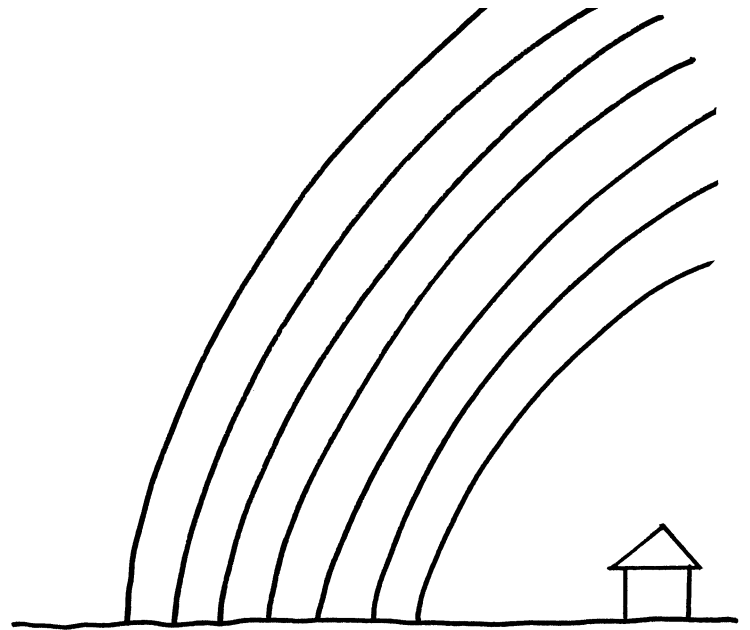
Birds Flying High:
Good weather is coming.



Cicadas Sing Loudly: This buzzing insect tells us that the weather will be nice.



Thunderhead: A cloud shaped like a mushroom. This usually marks the site of a big thunderstorm.



An Evening Rainbow:
There will be a strong wind.

Other signs of Bad Weather:

Red Sky in the Morning:
Expect bad weather.

Wind Changes Direction Quickly:
Expect bad weather with wind storms.

A Light Dew And No Wind:
Expect rain.

Fog on the Hilltops: Expect rain.

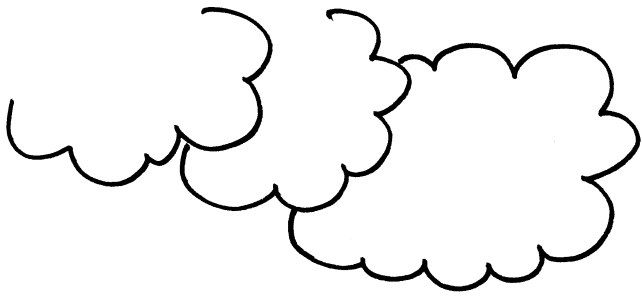
Deep Blue Sky During Rain: Showers will continue.

Other signs of Good Weather:

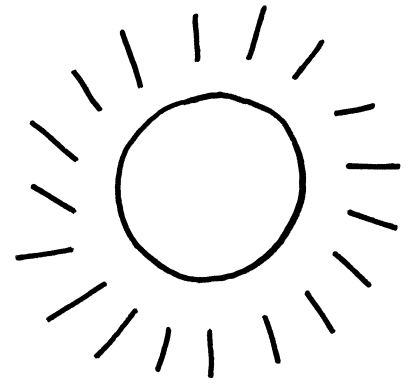
Wind Changes Direction Slowly:
The weather will be fair.

Heavy Dew: The day will be nice.

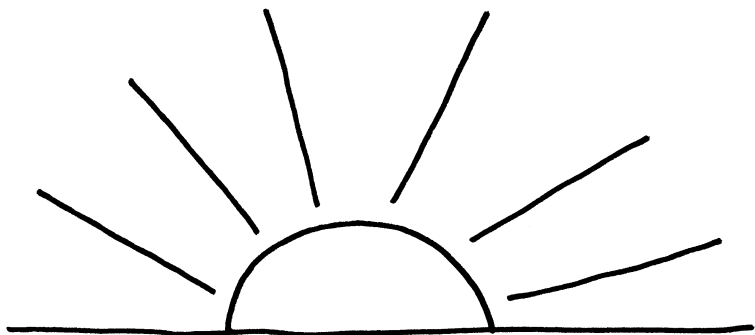
Fog on the Fields: It will be sunny.



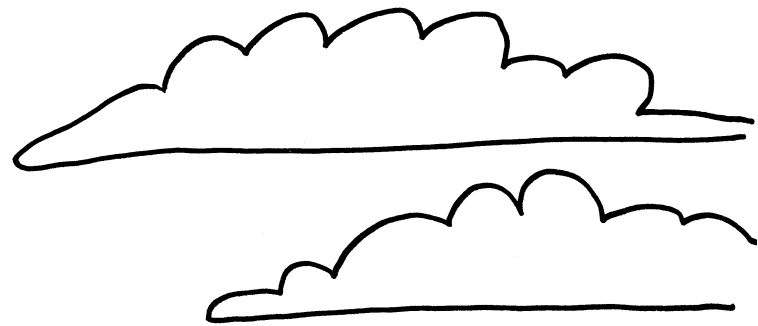
Alto cumulus Clouds: A high layer of many tightly packed little clouds. Usually this means that rain will come in 8 to 12 hours.



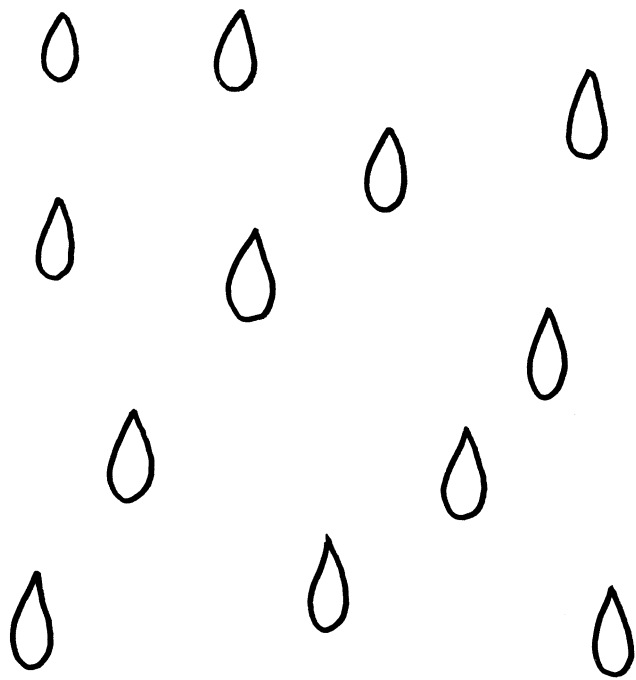
Halo Around The Sun: There will be rain in 10 - 12 hours.



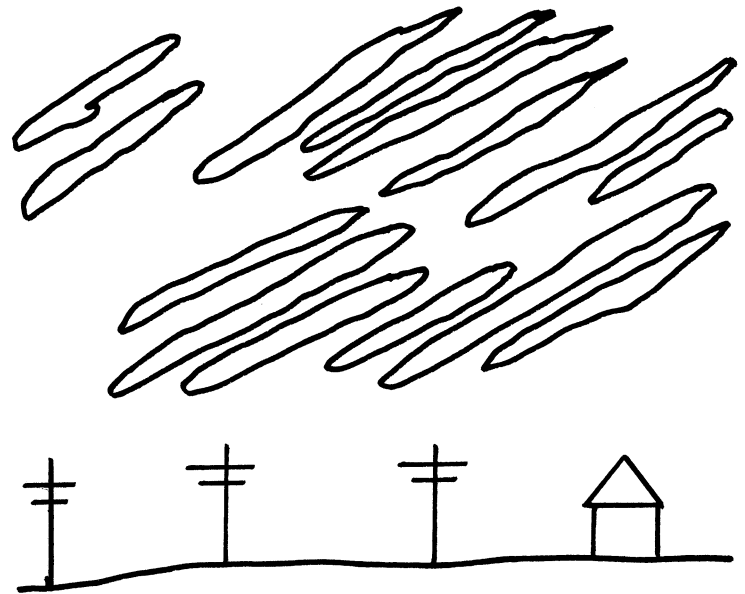
Red Sunset: Fine weather.



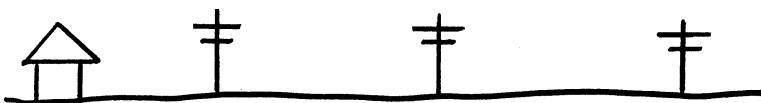
Fair Weather Cumulus Clouds: Fluffy white clouds with rounded tops. If they are small and float slowly along, they mean continued good weather.



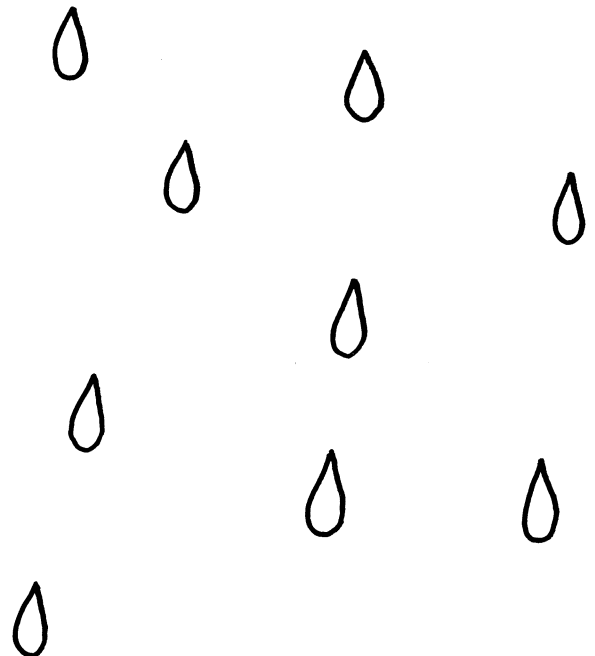
Greenish Sky During Rain: The Rain will become worse.



Cirrus Clouds: Very high, thin, wispy clouds that look like horse tails. When they start to cover the whole sky there's an 80 percent chance of rain in the next 24 hours.



Cirrocumulus Clouds: High, thin layers of clouds that look like waves on a beach. They mean continued good weather.



Deep Blue Sky During Rain: The Rain will continue as showers.
