## Vimy Ridge Foundation

The Vimy Foundation is placing history at the forefront of community leadership. Vimy Inspires Tomorrow encourages youth ages 13 to 17 to apply lessons from history to create transformative community projects.

Six activities drawing on different aspects of First World War history enable participants to examine, discuss, and exercise key leadership skills, all of which can be applied to their daily lives as they become leaders of tomorrow. Youth who complete one or more activities can submit a one-page proposal for a community project to be eligible for additional leadership training and a \$1,500 community project grant.

A facilitator's guide is also available with information about the activities, which are designed to adapt to online or in-person formats. The deadline to submit a one-page proposal is **January 31, 2023** but the activities are available online all year round. Participate today! An example of a Great Tip:

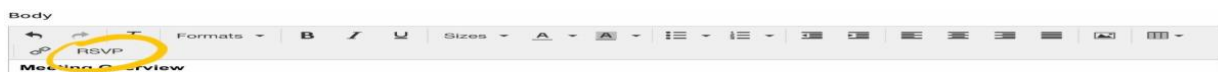
*Parents, Youth or Scouters RSVP to events  
in 1 click! (even without signing in)*

Sometimes you need to know numbers by a certain deadline, or even if you have ratio of scouters before sending out to families. This feature lets families or Scouters, RSVP with one click and without even needing to sign into ScoutsTracker (provided they have set up an account prior).

The RSVP feature is not automatic, you must to select it for the RSVP button to show on the email.

**Steps** (by Scouter sending the event email)

1. From your **Schedule** click on the event you want an RSVP on
2. Top right hand corner, select **Email**. Draft your email as usual.
3. Click **RSVP** to have the RSVP block added to your email.
4. Send as usual
