



## WOODBADGE PART II FOR CANADIAN PATH RECOGNITION REQUEST - NSC

**Council review and approval will be focused on the outcome that Scouters should get to the point where they can demonstrate a skill with minimal or infrequent support. The goal of Wood Badge II is to progress to Stage 3: I Can, of all 26 Scouter Development Cards that identify the skills required. Confirm completion of all the following:**

- Have the skills to conduct a safe and fun camping trip in all four seasons.
- Have the skills to conduct fun and safe cold-weather adventures.
- Demonstrate skills and describe equipment needed for safe outdoor adventures appropriate for my Section.
- Demonstrate the safe and effective use of tools required to have adventures in the outdoors.
- Facilitate a Program Quality Assessment with a Patrol (Team) in my Section.
- Understand why an engaged team of parents is important and can implement parent-engagement strategies.
- Demonstrate my role as a facilitator to enable a youth-led adventure that uses the Plan-Do-Review process.
- Incorporate the six Program Areas over the course of the year's adventures to ensure that the youth have the opportunity to develop in all of the SPICES.
- Describe the differences in age-appropriate program facilitation between my Section and an older or younger Section.
- Explain how Scouting develops well-rounded youth, better prepared for success in the world.
- Facilitate a fun, safe and constructive Section meeting.
- Describe the SPICES to youth members, and explain how each dimension applies to personal growth.
- Facilitate a youth-led STEM activity that allows youth to take charge in the design and implementation of the product, process or the experiment.
- Facilitate the Outdoor Adventure Skills program for youth in my Section.
- Describe Scouts Canada's three official fundraisers (Scout Popcorn, Scoutrees, Apple Day).
- Incorporate spirituality, as part of the SPICES, into the Canadian Path program.
- Understand the role of badges and can facilitate the use of badge programs appropriately.
- Facilitate the planning of a safe program that encourages youth leadership in age-appropriate ways.
- Facilitate a Scouting program that functions primarily in Patrols.
- Apply the youth-leadership structure appropriate to my Section.
- Facilitate an age-appropriate, youth-led weekend camp with my Section.
- Conduct a crucial conversation that results in a timely, constructive and respectful outcome.
- Demonstrate the shared leadership model as it applies to a team of Scouters.
- Explain how providing a Scouting experience to more young people helps accomplish Scouts Canada's mission.
- Identify and recruit Volunteers to help facilitate the Scouting program.
- Describe the five pillars of Volunteer Support (orientation, formal training, program tools, in-person support, feedback and recognition).
