Vaccination Status and Anticipated Announcement on Vaccination for 5-11 year olds

Please be reminded that as of November 1st, all Scouters, eligible youth and volunteers need to be fully-vaccinated in order to participate in Scouting activities in-person. Two separate reminders (Oct 27 and Oct 30) have been sent to all members and parents reminding those that have not already done so to update their vaccination status.

An announcement from the Federal Government is expected shortly regarding vaccine guidance for youth aged between 5 and 11. Scouts Canada has previously announced we expect to extend our vaccine mandate for all persons consistent with Federal guidance. We will review the expected announcement and we will monitor closely prior to expanding our approach.

Scouts Canada has consistently used guiding principles to shape our response and requirements. We continue to support the federal government and associated health authorities, and believe that widespread vaccine coverage is our best way to end the pandemic.

As of this time, if vaccination is approved for children aged 5-11 – our November 1 vaccine mandate will not apply to them immediately. We will need an implementation period. Until otherwise noted, there is no change, and children aged 5-11 can continue to participate in Scouting activities in person.
