Refund Policy Reminder

Scouts Canada will be offering the same refund policy as last year with regards to early registration (before Jan 1, 2022). Parents who register their children in Scouting this fall for the 2022 Scouting Year will have until January 30th to request a refund. The information below will be added to the JOIN and FAQ sections of Scouts.ca

Refund Terms

A parent may apply for a refund by selecting the "Request a Refund" option from their MyScouts account.

Refunds will be issued for 2022 registrations completed:

- On or before 1 January 2022, if refund request is received on or before 31 January 2022
- · After 1 January 2022, if request is received within 30 days of registration completion date

No refunds will be available outside of the above stated time-frame. Refunds will be issued in the manner in which the original payment was made.

BC Community Gaming Grants

All Human and Social Services not-for-profit organizations can apply to the Community Gaming Grant program for funding to support program delivery from June 1-November 30.
