Volunteer Readiness Report Enhancements

Thanks to some excellent feedback from our members, the MyScouts team has implemented a couple of enhancements to the Volunteer Readiness report.

While vaccination for youth aged 5-11 is not currently required to participate in in-person activities, Groups can now see the "Virtual Scouting Only" status for all members in the Volunteer Readiness

Report. Youth under the age of 12 will be listed as "under 12" so that Groups can quickly spot which youth the vaccine mandate does not currently apply to.



The Volunteer Readiness Report has also been updated with a column for the Group's Relationship Manager (if listed in MyScouts). This will enable Council and Group Support teams to more easily filter the report data based on who is supporting the Group.

Registration

Registration is now open! Scouting gives kids something fun to look forward to. By getting outside, connecting with their friends, and sharing new experiences, youth build resiliency and are motivated to blaze their own trail.

Even though numbers are reduced right now, we know this is temporary and that Scouts is needed now more than ever. We launched our digital ad campaign on January 10th and will be launching a PR campaign around the Claim the Flame.
