Vaccine Mandate

Scouts Canada joins all Canadians in the desire to see an end to the pandemic and to let kids get back to being kids again and enjoy all the benefits of Scouting. As we start to see the light at the end of the tunnel with the Feb 8 announcement of the removal of vaccine mandates in Saskatchewan and Alberta, we ask our membership to be patient.

There are NO CHANGES to our current national vaccine mandate for the moment. Scouts Canada will continue to monitor federal and provincial guidelines as well as the response from other organizations

across the country. Consistent with our on-going response to the pandemic, we will continue to balance risk and act prudently and cautiously. We will not act first but learn from others and continue to support and be guided by the direction set by federal and provincial health and civic leaders.

The board reiterates its support for vaccination and the critical role it plays in allowing us to return to a more normal Scouting experience. Amid a rapidly changing landscape, we believe that, consistent with our Guiding Principles, we will continue to review and evaluate our actions and policies to ensure they are aligned with our principles and reflect the most current conditions across the country.

Safe Scouting Update

Youth Protection is Everyone's Responsibility – Before COVID 19 restricted Scouting activities, in the 2018/19 Scouting Year, over half of the Youth Protection involving either sexually abusive or harmful behaviours were related to youth peer to peer incidents.

- Though potentially uncomfortable to discuss, include a conversation as a part of Safety Moments to discuss safe tenting practices to empower youth to feel safe and comfortable. For example, if a game of Truth or Dare (peer pressure, anyone?) is making a youth feel uncomfortable, where should they go? Which Scouter can they talk to? Is it appropriate for youth to be playing truth or dare to begin with?
- Peer to peer exploitation and harmful behaviours are preventable with proper supervision, quality program and establishment of safe spaces (safety talks and listening).
