# **MyScouts Update**

#### We are pleased to announce that MyScouts is back online!

We apologize for the inconvenience this cyber incident has caused. Since the cyber incident was detected on Dec 17, 2022, Scouts Canada engaged the services of two IT firms; an experienced Chief Information Security Officer from Fortium to help us oversee the investigation of the cyber incident and remediation process and our Managed Service Provider, Longview, to complete the detailed investigation and execute the solutions required to safely and successfully relaunch MyScouts. We apologize for the delay. Since the event occurred, we have patched the vulnerability that was responsible for the cyber incident and implemented further security protections before re-launching the system. We will continue to monitor MyScouts.

Scouts Canada has sent a renewal email to all members who have not yet renewed for the 2023 Scouting year. In addition, a reminder to those Scouters who have not yet completed their Respect in Sport certification will be sent on Friday January 20, 2023. And lastly, waitlist emails will be going out to the appropriate parents as well as registration emails to potential new registrants that have signed up to receive notification while the system was offline.

As a friendly reminder, now that MyScouts is online please doo review and update your Group's capacity for 2023 and update any screening items for Scouters.

The camp features several tenting areas, rustic cabins, and a large activity hall with a wood stove and a kitchen area. It is ideally suited for Scouting, Guiding, and other groups that want a back-to-basics camping experience. In addition, the camp has easy access to a hiking trail network and the nearby amenities of Cultus Lake.

Scouting groups will be able to reserve individual sites (with or without cabins) for small group adventures, or the entire property can be booked. The first reservable weekend will be April 21-23; this will give us time to complete a few maintenance activities before welcoming guests.

What if a Crucial Conversation Could Prevent a Safety Concern?

Have you ever been in a Group or Section where the dynamics were such that BAHD(Bullying, Abusive, Harassing, or Discriminatory) behaviours were just accepted, or even expected?

BAHD Behaviours, if tolerated and accepted over time, create a snowball affect - they grow and grow, and usually cause destruction as they rumble along. Accepting BAHD behaviours isn't the solution.

Use your Crucial Conversations skills to feel prepared and confident to have those conversations, and you may prevent a safety concern before it happens.

The longer a BAHD behaviour is tolerated, the more the BAHD behaviour is accepted, the more tension in the Group, the higher the risk for a youth protection safety concern.

Crucial Conversations can be daunting, but if you need help with preparing to have a crucial conversation, we're here to help! Refresh or visit the David Huestis Learning Centre (when available) to access the Learning Module.
