
22nd Annual Victoria Klondike Derby



The Klondike Derby is a contest requiring teamwork and tests the "Scouting Skills" of Scouts. Teams of 4 to 8 members pull a wagon over a course of approximately 4 km through the woods around Camp Barnard. The team visits ten Klondike "towns" where the "town mayor" assigns the team a particular task or activity. Points are awarded to the team based on how well it performs the task, the speed and the teamwork.

ScoutsTracker Online Training

ScoutsTracker now includes built-in training, so you can develop your expertise and maximize the speed and efficiency with which you carry out both simple and complex section administration tasks. As you carry out tasks in ScoutsTracker you'll automatically complete training skills, but you can come here to either look up how to do something, or you can let ScoutsTracker recommend some new skills for you to tackle.

As you complete more training skills, you'll automatically advance to the next Stage (just like an OAS!). Note: your stage is based on the total number of skills, which is changing as more training is added. So if you suddenly find you've dropped down a stage, don't worry... just come back here and see what's new!

Changing Seasons, things to be aware of...

Seasons changing is just one way that our environments can change – what works for a meeting time and place in the summer might not be the safest option in fall or winter. For example, when engaging in nighttime activities such as hiking, camping, games, or any outdoor wide games, adequate lighting is essential to prevent accidents and injuries.

In our example of decreased daylight from summer to winter, days become shorter and it gets dark much earlier. Limited visibility significantly increases the risk of mishaps. In this example of reviewing plans to accommodate a changing environment, why does proper lighting matter?

Enhanced Visibility: Good lighting helps you see potential hazards like uneven terrain, obstacles, or wildlife, reducing the risk of trips, falls, or collisions. Those tent guy lines won't be visible at night time, and pose a tripping hazard.

Injury Prevention: Adequate lighting minimizes the chances of sprains, strains, or fractures by enabling you to make informed, safe movements.

Quick Response: In emergencies, proper lighting allows for quicker and more effective responses, whether it's first aid, navigation, or seeking help.

Confidence and Comfort: Well-lit surroundings boost your confidence and comfort, making the experience more enjoyable and stress-free.

What can Scouters and GCs do to remain vigilant about safety in changing environments:

Revisit the AAF/ERP for regularly scheduled meetings; are there any new hazards to avoid like icy walkways or slippery wet floors?

• Brainstorm safety tips as a safety moment with youth to ask them to identify hazards for fall and winter that weren't hazards in the spring and summer.

• Will the section be spending more time indoors in close proximity to each other? Illness spreads more easily in these conditions; what can the section do to prevent the spreading of illnesses?

• The temperature outside will be lower; how will the Section come prepared for this hazard?
