22nd Annual Victoria Klondike Derby



The Klondike Derby is a contest requiring teamwork and tests the "Scouting Skills" of Scouts. Teams of 4 to 8 members pull a wagon over a course of approximately 4 km through the woods around Camp

Barnard. The team visits ten Klondike "towns" where the "town mayor" assigns the team a particular task or activity. Points are awarded to the team based on how well it performs the task, the speed and the teamwork.

ScoutsTracker Online Training

As you carry out tasks in ScoutsTracker you'll automatically complete training skills, but you can come here to either look up how to do something, or you can let ScoutsTracker recommend some new skills for you to tackle.

As you complete more training skills, you'll automatically advance to the next Stage (just like an OAS!). Note: your stage is based on the total number of skills, which is changing as more training is added. So if you suddenly find you've dropped down a stage, don't worry...

Incident Reports...Learning Opportunities

When incident reports are submitted, they are valuable lessons learned. When we think about what we can do to prevent injuries, it would be nice to have a crystal ball to tell us what could happen. In a sense, the injuries from previous years are the metaphorical "crystal ball".

So what do we know about injuries sustained during the winter months, according to injury reports?

- The top three major injury types during winter months are fractures, cuts requiring stitches or glue, and concussions.
- Top three actions causing these injuries are result of:
 - "*Struck Against*" this is consistent with many serious tobogganing injuries. We know youth will slide into stationary objects on toboggan hills.
 - "Fall from Same Level" this is the action causing injury for all the slips, trips and falls.
 - "Fall from Height" this is the action causing injury for the many falls from playground equipment and "catching air" on toboggan hills.

What are some preventative measures that Groups can take to reduce the risk of injury for these activities?

Preventing injuries caused by "Struck Against" – do site inspections, especially at toboggan hills. What can be done to reduce the risk? If the risk cannot be reduced, consider a safer toboggan hill.

Preventing injuries caused by "Fall at Same Level" – safety moments before hikes, removal of tripping hazards when indoors and playing games in the gym, proper footwear, and tied shoe laces are all great strategies to reduce the risk of slips, trips, and falls.

- Preventing injuries caused by Fall from Height playgrounds in the winter are far more risky than playgrounds in the summer months. It gets darker earlier in the winter and conditions can be icy and slippery, and mitts can reduce how effective a grip on a monkey bar is. Is there a safer alternative to a visit to a playground?
