National Commissioner & National Youth Commissioner

The Nominating Committee of Scouts Canada is seeking applications for the positions of National Commissioner and National Youth Commissioner.

Candidates for these key volunteer roles at Scouts Canada should be committed to the values and principles of Scouting. Each should believe firmly that the Scouting movement is of benefit to Canadian society and be respected for their honesty, integrity, and personal ethics.

National Commissioner

The National Commissioner is responsible for partnering with the CEO and National Youth Commissioner to advance the operations of Scouts Canada. Together, the National "Key 3" oversees the implementation of the Scouts Canada Strategic Plan that is established by the Board of Governors. This includes working with both Councils & Functional Teams on execution of the plan and with the Board of Governors in reporting on progress toward organizational goals.

The National Commissioner is also one of the key public representatives of Scouts Canada. This includes frequent engagement with our members, their parents, sponsors, governments, the media and more. The National Commissioner also serves as an officer and member of the Scouts Canada Board of Governors.

In collaboration with the other members of the National Key 3, the National Commissioner provides direct support to several of our Councils, assisting them to ensure that more youth in their communities benefit from high quality Scouting programs. To be successful, the National Commissioner needs to be deeply committed to our model of shared leadership — partnering with volunteers, professionals, and young people to make all key decisions for the organization.

The National Commissioner position will require a significant time commitment. This includes participation in many Board of Governors & Scouts Canada Leadership Team meetings per year, the Annual General Meeting, major Scouting activities such as Jamborees and public events, in addition to engagement with local groups across Canada. Youth members over the age of 18 are welcome to apply for the National Commissioner Role.

The National Youth Commissioner is responsible for partnering with the National Commissioner and CEO to advance the operations of Scouts Canada. Together, the National "Key 3" oversees the implementation of the Scouts Canada Strategic Plan. The National Youth Commissioner is also one of the key public representatives of Scouts Canada. This includes frequent engagement with our members, their parents, sponsors, governments, the media and more. The National Youth Commissioner also serves as an officer and member of the Scouts Canada Board of Governors.

In collaboration with the other members of the National Key 3, the National Youth Commissioner provides direct support to several of our Councils, assisting them to ensure that more youth in their communities benefit from high quality Scouting programs. To be successful, the National Youth Commissioner needs to be deeply committed to our model of shared leadership — partnering with professionals and young people to make all key decisions for the organization.

The National Youth Commissioner position will require a significant time commitment. This includes participation in many Board of Governors and Scouts Canada Leadership Team meetings per year, the Annual General Meeting, major Scouting activities such as Jamborees and public events, in addition to engagement with local groups across Canada. Applicants for the National Youth Commissioner Position should be able to fulfil the role as a Youth Member (Under the Age of 27) until the AGM three years from their date of appointment (expected to be November 20, 2027).

For either of the above positions, you may submit your name for consideration or recommend others. Each submission must include a written confirmation from the individual acknowledging that they are willing to serve and that they have an understanding of the position, be accompanied by a CV, including scouting and professional backgrounds and experience, and also include a brief statement (max 450 words) on why the nominee or applicant is applying, what they believe the major issues facing Scouts Canada are, what they believe they bring to the role, and what they would most like to achieve if successful.

All submissions must be sent to Andrew Obee, outgoing Chair of the National Nominating Committee (<u>andrew.obee@scouts.ca</u>) by March 8, 2024 at 5:00pm ET.
