NiteHike is a fun all night adventure which allows Cubs & Scouts (and energetic Beavers) to complete a series of fun and challenging Activity

Stations throughout Pacific Spirit Park (Vancouver Point Grey).

Groups start off on the hike between 6pm to 8pm and have fun completing approximately 20-24 stations along the way that host games and challenges. 
Registration is open for Vancouver Island Wolf Howl.

Pacific Jamboree 2024 Update

With Jamboree only three months away, the Registration team is working hard to finalize all the participant registration details.

Patrols with no Sub Camp or Patrol number - If you have registered a patrol but do not yet have a sub camp assignment or patrol number, please log into your patrol dashboard and check that all is in order. Check to ensure your participants are assigned to the patrol, all Scouters must have a photo loaded and all data is entered and valid; i.e. no missing contact info or dates of birth.

The deadline for registration is fast approaching - please take a moment to review your dashboard and contact us if you need help. If everything seems to be in order and you still haven't been sent a sub camp and patrol number, please reach out to the <u>pj2024registrations@scouts.ca</u> email with your Group name in the subject line.

Adding Participants - If you intended to add a participant to your patrol but you missed the March 15th cut off, we have extended the opening so please send your request in ASAP. Fees for new participants (adult or youth) is 603.75 with at least \$500 paid at time of registration and \$103.75 due by April 30th.

The criteria are

- Youth must be registered in Troop and be between 11 and 15 during the Jamboree week.
- Scouters must be Registered members screening and training requirements must be met by April 1, 2024.
- There is no ability to increase the number of patrols, you may add youth to an existing patrol as long as it does not take you over the maximum of 8 youth.
- Patrols do not need to already be assigned a sub camp and patrol number to apply to add a participant.
- New participants are subject to the regular Jamboree fee of \$603.75. \$500 paid at time of registration and \$103.75 due by April 30th.

• Requests to add participants must come from the contact scouter

- Identify the participant name (first and last name) youth or adult
- which patrol you'd like to add them to
- confirmation that the addition of this youth does not take you over the maximum 8 for the patrol

Reminder - Members added to a patrol now must still meet all the payment and screening and training deadlines.
